INTRODUCTION



Dear Friends.

2014 was particularly important for Harambee as it was characterized by the Beatification of Msgr Alvaro del Portillo (Madrid, September 25th) who inspired the name of our Organization: "Harambee", a Swahili word meaning "all together". During one of his trips in Africa he said: "I know that you use the expression 'Harambee!' for many things: setting up a school, building a church, lots of material goals; and some contribute money, others give bricks, everyone does what they can".

In reason of this special event, in 2014 Harambee selected 4 projects: three were started as a direct response to Msgr Alvaro del Portillo's insistence, during his visits to D. R. of Congo, Ivory Coast and Nigeria, on the need to contribute to solving local problems, and the fourth is to provide grants to African priests to study in Rome. Each project addresses the most pressing needs among the poorest in these countries thereby increasing hope and improving the quality of life for these people, both signs of true development.

The information in this Annual Report for 2014 also reflects the positive results attained by several projects in Cameroon, Benin, Togo, Kenya, Mozambique and Rwanda. A University cooperation project between Kenya and Austria was possible thanks to a scholarship offered to the Strathmore University's students.

Moreover, by the objective of spreading more authentic knowledge about the African continent many awareness and informative initiatives were carried out in Italy as well as in several other European countries and the United States.

Pope Francis constantly asks for our generosity and our effort to make the world a better place: "Let's open our eyes to see the misery in the world. So many of our brothers and sisters are denied their dignity! And let us recognize that we are compelled to heed their cry for help! May we reach out to them and support them so they can feel the warmth of our presence, our friendship, and our fraternity."

Harambee's response is decisive! Just as Blessed Alvaro del Portillo affirmed, we say: "We will contribute with our effort, our prayer, our work well-done. Everyone can contribute in this way, rich or poor. Perhaps the one who does his work with more love of God is the richest one before God."

PROJECTS 2014 - 2015

In 2014 several projects – in Cameroon, Benin, Togo, Kenya and Mozambique – came to the conclusion.

A cooperation university program was then set up between Austria and Kenya, thanks to a scholarship offered to Strathmore University's students of Nairobi.

The work for the expansion of the St. Mark Primary School (Misanze District, Rwanda) went on and at the end of this project the school will be able to accommodate more than double of the students currently attending, helping to combat the problem of juvenile delinquency.

In December 2014, the first phase of the Harambee fund raising campaign ended giving the opportunity to start – in the current year – 4 projects in Nigeria, Ivory Coast, Dem. Rep. of Congo, Rome (Scholarships for African seminarians).



Supply of Educational Materials for schools in the Region of Hauts Plateaux

Promoter: CEST - Coalition Education et Santé pour Tous

Beneficiaries: 5 schools

Description: The project is based on previous programs promoted by CEST and supported by Harambee to strength the quality of education in schools in the rural region of Hauts-Plateaux. During 2 years, 350 teachers were trained. The purpose of this project is to distribute 2,000 books in 5 schools reached by previous initiatives to enable teachers to carry out their educational programs in a context where 40% of children cannot afford reading books and 60% haven't got books on arithmetic.

Funds raised and allocated in 2014: 5,136 €

RESULTS

2,000 books were distributed throughout the five schools that benefitted from the project.



Enlargement of St. Mark Primary School, Musanze's District

Promoter: Ruhengeri's Diocese

Beneficiaries: 250 students

Description: St. Mark's School, built in 2009 thanks to the support of Harambee, is able to accommodate hundreds of students each year and it is forced to reject many applications from families unable to support the costs. Amongst the consequences there is a high risk of youth deviance. Objective of the project is therefore to expand the school to reduce the number of pupils per class and open doors to new members.

Funds raised and allocated in 2014: 20,000 €



RESULTS

12 classrooms and the administrative unit built.



Education Strengthening Project for Children in Nima, Parakou

Promoter: Envol Afrique

Beneficiaries: 100 students between the ages of 8 and 15.

Description: The project objective, started in 2012, is to support an afterschool program to improve the scholastic progress of students, thus favouring the prevention of criminal activities.

Funds raised and allocated in 2014: 4,000 €

RESULTS

- 25 students full time and 39 students part time could attend afterschool activities with text books and the support of teachers who regularly received a salary.
- 169 students could attend afterschool activities during summer holiday.



Realization and Launching of the "Centre Catholique de Formation Professionnelle Madre Agata Carelli"

Promoter: The Canossian Foundation

Beneficiaries: 70 Togolese students between 13 and 19 years old; students and teachers from Europe.

Description: In order to permit a larger number of admissions, the project provides for the construction and furnishing of new classrooms and laboratories, the realization of brief-long period exchange programs between Italian and Togolese teachers and students and the beginning of an educational development program that will eventually allow for the courses held at the Center to be recognized at the university level.

Funds raised and allocated in 2014: 6,000 €

RESULTS

- Classrooms and laboratories completed for 90 students.
- Training session between female students and Italian (from Trento) and Togolese teachers implemented.



Improving the Professional Training of Disadvantaged Young People

Promoter: Strathmore Educational Trust

Beneficiaries: 80 young people between 18 and 25 and two teachers.

Description: Harambee continues to support the new activities launched by the "Eastlands" project – an initiative set up by the "Strathmore Educational Trust" for the creation of a polytechnic institute that offers professional training in the East areas of Nairobi, which suffer great social marginalization. The project covers the some equipment costs and the construction of a classroom inside the new complex that will house the school and provide staff training.

Funds raised and allocated in 2014: 10,500 €

RESULTS

- Equipment of the laboratory completed;
- 2 teachers got a diploma in ITC;
- 130 students trained (instead of 80 students foreseen).



Hotel Training in Kuruwitu, in Kilifi County

Promoter: Kianda Foundation

Beneficiaries: 90 girls each year for the hotel training courses and 200 women for the "Outreach programs".

Description: The goal is to reduce the level of poverty in the region by training young women in the hotel field to facilitate their efforts in finding work or initiating their own activities. The young women that will participate in the professional training programs are between the ages of 16 and 25. The Tewa Training Center will also manage an "outreach program" that will offer locals courses on nutrition, agriculture, sewing and literacy. 90 girls each year will benefit from the hotel training courses and 200 women each year from the outreach program.

Funds raised and allocated in 2014: 10,500 €

RESULTS

200 women from rural villages attended at "Technical multi-skills training in Hospitality" after that they could find a job or they started micro-enterprises up.



Promoting Apprenticeships and Establishing Small Businesses in Chitima, in the province of Tete

Promoter: O Viveiro Tete - Sonha com os Anjos

Beneficiaries: 12 workers from the *O Viveiro* Center, 10 teachers and 30 students that will participate in the training program organized at the center, around 70 families from the Tete community involved in the program to launch small businesses.

Description: the project aims at strengthening vocational training for young girls of *O Viveiro* Centre in order to start up micro businesses in the rural sector.

Funds raised and allocated in 2014: 4,000 €

RESULTS

73 families received professional training to start their own businesses in agriculture, crafts ad farming.



University Cooperation Project in Bio-mimicry

Promoter: FH Burgenland University, Austria

Beneficiaries: Strathmore University's students, Kenya

Description: The goal is a university cooperation project in bio-mimicry sector between FH Burgenland University, Austria, and Strathmore University, Kenya. The project will fund 10 scholarships for students of Strathmore University to attend at a seminar and set up a joint project.

Funds raised and allocated in 2014: 3,000 €

RESULTS

Set up of a seminar with the participation of 10 students from Strathmore University.



Niger Foundation Hospital (NFH)

Promoter: Niger Foundation Hospital and Diagnostic Centre (NFH) was set up in 1990 to promote and improve the health status of a wide range of people in Enugu, the capital of Enugu State (in the south eastern part of Nigeria better known as Biafra). At present the hospital offers the following services: consultation, diagnostic and therapeutic services; radiology services; laboratory services; and in-patient facilities for 40 persons.


Beneficiaries: he project will mainly benefit women and children among the lowest income groups who live in the Enugu metropolis (with an estimated population of 1.2 million) and in a more specific way, the inhabitants of Ezeagu, a rural area in the hospital surroundings, (with an estimated population of 200,000).

Description: The quality of healthcare delivery in Nigeria is low. A very central problem is the lack of adequate infrastructure and equipment as well as competent manpower. Some studies suggest that there is a death rate of 5-10% for major surgery, and that approximately 7 million patients undergoing surgery each year have major complications, including 1 million that die dur-

ing or immediately after surgery. It is a fact that many inhabitants of Enugu do not have effective access to surgical care. The project seeks to focus on improving Niger Foundation Hospital's ability to carry out basic to intermediate-level surgical procedures, purchasing surgical instruments, and raising the professional standard of surgical nurses and doctors:

- **1. To offer better surgical care** through a more suitable training program for the surgery assistants and doctors, and by purchasing an anesthetic machine and an autoclave for sterilization of surgical instruments;
- 2. To augment a health awareness program on General Hygiene and preventive healthcare measures. This includes more extensive education for early detection of wide-spread viral infectious diseases, such as hepatitis, HIV and massive vaccinations against common infections;
- **3. To build a Mother and Child Care Center.** Such a building would provide a proper infrastructure that would consist of a maternity and pediatric ward; a staff training room; patient consulting rooms; a pharmacy; delivery room and operating theater.

Funds raised in 2014 to be allocated in 2015: 100,000 €



Fighting Malnutrition in Bingerville Area

Promoter: the Association for Social and Cultural Development - ADESC. ADESC was established in 1984 in Abidjan, with the aim of improving the living conditions of the population in the Bingerville region. In 1998, ADESC was able to build the Ilomba Rural Center in this area as a resource for the local people. There various healthcare initiatives, including campaigns against child malnutrition, hygiene and nutrition courses for mothers, and professional training in textile manufacturing have been offered ever since. Literacy courses and other educational activities to reduce the number of school dropouts in the area have also been offered.

Beneficiaries: the direct beneficiaries will be 5,525 Bingerville residents, mostly young women. The indirect beneficiaries who will notice an immediate impact will be the families of 14,000 people in the area.


Description: In recent years, Ivory Coast has experienced varying degrees of instability with accompanying deterioration in living conditions of the population, particularly in rural areas such as Bingerville. But the 2002 civil war created a still

more serious crisis since it caused the loss of coffee and cocoa export capability, the pillar of lvory Coast's economy, with its consequent impact on the quality of life. With a tropical, humid climate and a lack of infrastructure of all kinds, the Bingerville region's living conditions have gotten progressively worse.

The ADESC proposes to address the need by improving the health and nutrition of the citizens of Bingerville in the following ways:

- 1. through a widespread campaign against malnutrition by giving hygiene and nutrition training courses for women; and, upon purchasing a vehicle for this purpose, by performing home health visits for medical care to approximately 5,000 people;
- 2. by targeting women between 18 and 35, to end the poverty cycle and improve the living conditions of women in extreme poverty through vocational training that prepares them to be self-supporting and contribute to the local economy;
- 3. by providing secondary school courses to 25 young people.

Funds allocated in 2014: $10,000 \in$ Funds raised in 2014 to be allocated in 2015: $90,000 \in$



Strengthening three health clinics in the outskirts of Kinshasa

Promoter: Centre Congolais de Culture de Formation et Développement - CECFOR. In 1991 this association in the Congo founded the Monkole Hospital in Kinshasa in the region of Mont-Ngafula. The hospital currently serves more than 80,000 patients per year (48,000 are women of which 70% live in conditions of extreme poverty).

Beneficiaries:

For the first objective:

- 10,000 children per year are visited in the three clinics:
- 2,000 pre and post-natal consultations per year in the three clinics;
- more than 25,000 people per year receive medical assistance per year thanks to the three clinics.

For the second objective:

- 200 young women who register for a diploma in nursing;
- 75 nurses who register for a specialization course in nursing;
- 800 nurses/teachers who attend Continuing Professional Development programs;
- at least 150 people receive scholarships for ISSI training.

Description: the city of Kinshasa has 10 million inhabitants, most of which are poorly nourished and depend on subsistence farming for their livelihoods, in a country in which 74% of the population is malnourished and 80% live in absolute poverty. This precarious state of general health has given rise to the need for medical services that the public health system is not able to meet due to a lack of resources, infrastructures and adequately trained personnel. The Monkole Hospital has tried to respond to this emergency by offering four general medical services - maternity, pediatrics, internal medicine and general surgery -, creating three clinics (in Eliba, Kimbondo and Moluka) in the outskirts of the city (that are not easy to reach) and by implementing training programs for medical and paramedical personnel. The project has the following objectives:

- 1. Reinforce the human and technological capabilities of the health clinics in Eliba, Kimbondo and Moluka;
- **2. Improve professional training for nurses** by strengthening the *Institut Superieur en Sciences Infirmières* ISSI.

Funds raised in 2014 to be allocated in 2015: 100.000 €.





Sub-Saharan Africa meets Rome. Scholarships for African priests and seminarians to study in Rome.

Promoter: The Pontifical University of the Holy Cross was born in Rome from the desire of St. Josemaría Escrivá, founder of Opus Dei, to promote a center of higher education for ecclesiastical studies that would be at the service of the whole Church. In 1984, his successor, Bishop Alvaro del Portillo, with the blessing of John Paul II, brought St. Josemaría's dream to completion by inaugurating the Roman Academic Center, later know as the Pontifical Atheneum of the Holy Cross. In July 1998, Pope John Paul II granted it the title of University. It currently has Schools of Theology, Canon Law, Philosophy and Social Institutional Communications. Many bishops from around the world send priests and seminarians of their respective dioceses to Rome hoping to provide them with a deep scientific and spiritual formation.

Beneficiaries: Priests and seminarians from dioceses in Africa who cannot access ecclesiastical studies in Rome due to lack of funds.

Description: The Pontifical University of the Holy Cross gives such formation through a broad and thorough work of research and formation in the ecclesiastical sciences, thus helping dioceses in the whole world to cooperate fully with the evangelizing mission of the Church. Annual student costs are financed through total scholarships of 13,500 Euros per person for: tuition fees, books and insurance, food and residence.

Funds raised in 2014 to be allocated in 2015: 27,000 €

Primary Premium Programme and Support for St. Michael School

A contribution of 6,000 Euros has been sent to Diocesi of Kitui to support interventions at improving learning capacities of children with disabilities from emarginated areas.



Support to Monkole Hospital

In 2014 a contribution of 3,675 Euros has been sent to Monkole Hospital, Kinshasa, Dem. Rep. of Congo.



CONVEYING AFRICA


"Born in Congo", a photographic exhibition created by Harambee


A guided tour of the Frida Kahlo Exhibit was held on April 15th for friends of Harambee Africa In-

The initiatives took place in Fribourg and Lausanne and the funds raised were addressed to the Harambee projects in Africa.


"A Team for the World for Africa", Football Match for Harambee

Harambee Africa International offers an action plan for cultural authorities, universities and youth clubs that includes sports and cultural and volunteer activities:

Harambee Sport:

Participation in "light" athletic competitions (short and long-distance running and marathons), rugby and soccer with Harambee. The two objectives are:

- 1) to raise funds for Harambee's educational projects in Africa;
- 2) to bring young men and women closer to young Africans through sports, highlighting the positive will to fight that Africa's younger generation possesses.

Harambee Meetings:

Various topics and a plethora of experts to bring about the organization of formal and informal meetings, seminars and conferences on current affairs in Africa.

Harambee Volunteers:

Training programs to make participants more aware of the cultural, spiritual and economic potential of Sub-Sahara Africa. The work sessions:

a) bring about volunteer initiatives that focus on the distribution and promotion of projects supported by Harambee Africa International through fund-raising activities and the organization of "Activity Days" on the African continent for public and private entities; b) promote the creation of work sites in some African countries, with the agreement of Harambee partners in Kenya, Nigeria, the Congo and the Cameroon.
